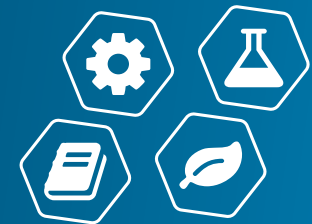

Post-degree, advanced diplomas & graduate certificates

A bachelor's degree with a **minimum B average** in the last two years of study and;

Fulfill one of the English Language requirements for graduate programs (if the previous degree was obtained in a country where English is not the primary/official language and from a university where English was not the language of instruction)

Additional requirements may include:

- a) Resume (showing specific work experience)
- b) Statement of interest
- c) Supporting documents/letters of recommendation
- d) An interview

For students who meet the academic requirements but not the English language requirement, **conditional acceptance** into some VIU programs may be granted. In this case, admission is granted pending completion of VIU's English Language program (level UP5 for undergraduate and Grad Prep English for graduate programs).

1 Before you apply

- Your transcripts and a copy of your credential (diploma or degree)
- Proof of English language proficiency
- Certified English translation* of any documents issued in a language other than English
- A copy of your passport (photo page)

**All documents must be translated by a certified translator or notarized if in a language other than English.*

2 Applying

Submit your application online:

- Scan all documents (in separate files).
- Fill in the online International Application for Admission. (world.viu.ca/apply)
- Upload your scanned documents in separate files.
- Pay the \$150 (CAD) non-refundable application processing fee (Visa, Mastercard, and American Express are preferred. Cheque, money order, and electronic transfer also accepted).
- Upon receipt of your application, supporting documents and application fee payment you will receive an acknowledgment email from the Admissions office.

Note: *Your application will not be processed until the \$150 (CAD) application fee is received, and all required scanned documents have been uploaded.*

3 After you apply

- Once your application fee has been paid and all of your documents have been received, we will begin to evaluate your application.
- It can take from 2-8 weeks to process an application. Ensuring that your application is complete and all of your documents are scanned in separate files and submitted with your application will decrease the wait time.

Note: *Master's programs and limited entry programs may take longer.*

- You will receive a **Letter of Offer (LOO)**, if you have met the admission requirements and have a competitive application. The **LOO** contains information on program start dates and instructions to pay your tuition deposit. To accept the offer, pay the tuition deposit and submit requested documents by the date indicated in the **LOO**.
- Once the tuition deposit has been paid an official **Letter of Acceptance (LOA)** will be emailed to you. With the **LOA** you may apply for your study permit online at cic.gc.ca or at an authorised Visa Application Centre in your country. Be sure to apply early for your study permit and notify International Admissions if your study permit application has been unsuccessful.
- Bring your original documents to Canada, if not mailed in advance.
- Ensure that we have an email address that you check regularly, and then **read all emails carefully**. These emails will include important pre-arrival information including course registration instructions, immigration information and housing deadlines.

Note: *As some programs fill before the application deadline, we encourage all students to apply early.*

University transfer credit

If you have taken courses at another university, you may be able to receive transfer credit at **VIU** (max. 50% of program).

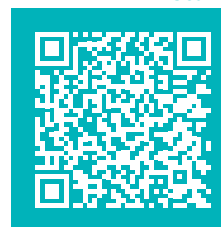

International University Foundation Year

The International University Foundation Year at **Vancouver Island University (VIU)** is an **eight-month program** designed for international students who need to complete a qualifying year in order to meet Admissions requirements for undergraduate studies at **VIU**.

This is a full-time program with between **25 to 40 hours of study required per week**. Upon successful completion, you are guaranteed entry to the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Business Administration, Bachelor of Science, and Bachelor of Hospitality Management at **Vancouver Island University**. Contact us if you are interested in attending a different program at **VIU**.

- Applications are accepted throughout the year.

Admission Requirements

- Passport photo page.
- For students aged 18 years and older by December 31 following a September enrollment. Students who are 16-17 should contact **unipath@viu.ca** for a customised foundation option.
- Minimum of 3 O-level subjects with a grade above C. We will accept provisional results as long as we receive final results by August.
- Minimum IELTS of 6.0 overall with no band below 5.5, or equivalent.*

**Proof of English language proficiency is required from applicants for whom English is not their first language or from those whose education was completed in any country where English is not an official language.*

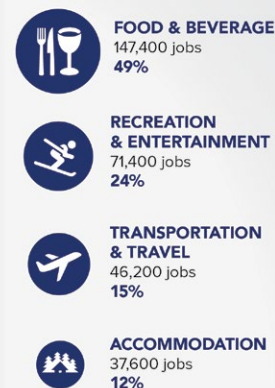


Provincial Snapshot: BC'S TOURISM INDUSTRY WORKFORCE

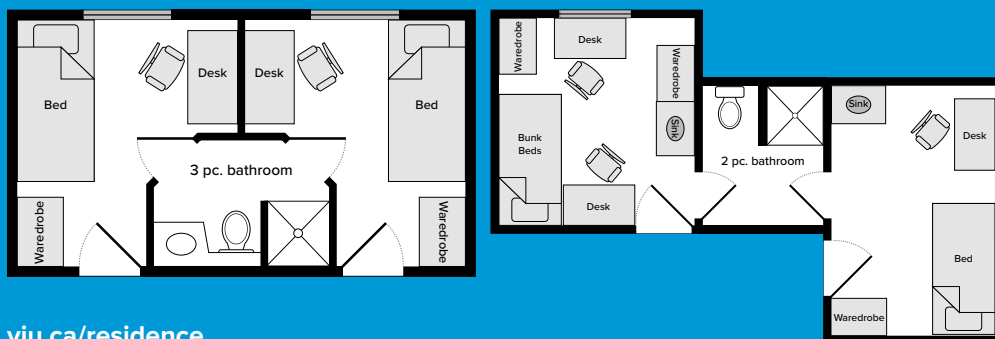

Work in Canada

On campus

- Can work any amount of hours during semester and scheduled (study) breaks.
- Can work on or off campus if your study permit lists a condition that says “you’re allowed to work on- or off-campus.”
- Have a Social Insurance Number (SIN)

Co-op or Intern

- Work permit required
- The intended employment must be an essential part of the academic program, but not exceeding 50% of it

Off campus

- 20 hr/week during semesters and full-time during study breaks
- Can work on or off campus if your study permit lists a condition that says “you’re allowed to work on- or off-campus.”
- Program must be at least 6 months long
- Have valid study permit, be a full-time student

Post-graduation

- Work permit required (e.g. PGWP)
- Graduation from VIU or other eligible DLI
- Length of PGWP ranges 8 months – 3 years
