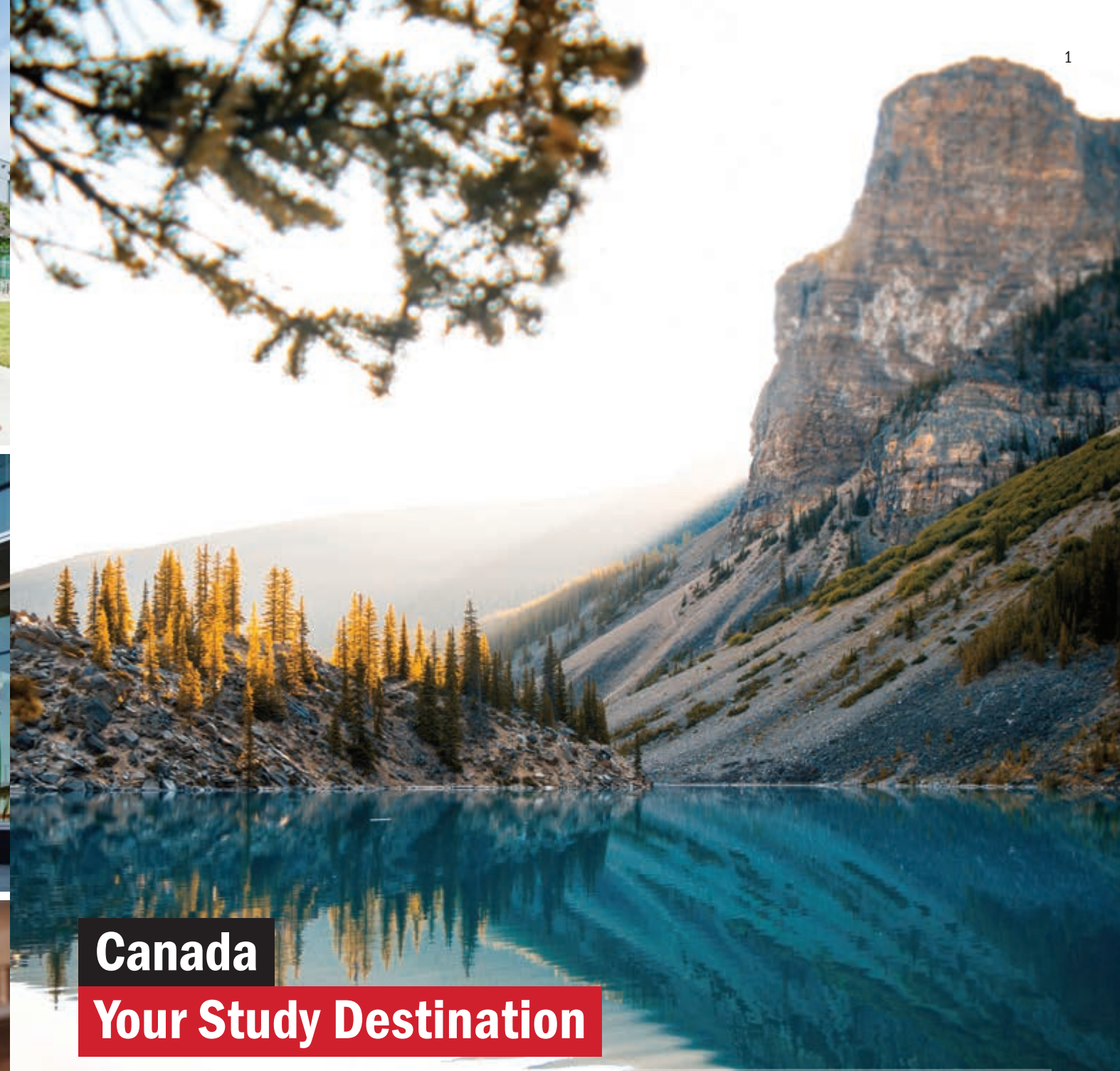

DIPLOMA IN MULTIMEDIA DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT

Prior to earning my diploma in Multimedia Design at Humber College, I completed my bachelor's degree in fashion in Singapore. I worked with an Australian children's couture brand, Mischka Aoki, as an Assistant Designer. In 2017, I decided to start my own bespoke fashion brand in Indonesia. Two years into my business, I realized that I still had so much more to explore now I'm in Toronto!

I believe that design is a form of communication and I always try to expand my design skills. One of the most meaningful lessons I've learned at Humber is how to be an empathetic designer. This entails thinking of my audience first and becoming more in-tune with the purpose and impact of the design rather than just caring about the aesthetic.

The work-integrated course that I took at Humber also helped me transition seamlessly from doing school work to taking part in an internship and working with clients. I worked as a Graphic Design Intern in the Consulate General of Indonesia in Toronto and the Ontario Chamber of Commerce, the latter of which was thanks to Humber's CareerConnect job portal. Beyond the internship, the lecturers at Humber were very proactive in finding "clients" to take part in our various industry projects, from non-profit organizations to the City of Toronto. NORTH CAMPUS

Humber's North Campus is located in the northwestern part of Toronto and is easily accessible by Toronto public transit. POST-GRADUATION WORK PERMIT

If you are in a program of eight months or more, you may be eligible to apply for a Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP) upon graduation.

WORKING WHILE STUDYING

Part-time employment opportunities are available for international students to work both on and off campus. You may be eligible to work up to 24 hours per week on campus, or up to 20 hours per week off campus, during regular school sessions. Additionally, you may also be eligible to work full time during scheduled breaks, such as the winter and summer holidays or reading week.

WORKING ON CAMPUS

Working on campus will help you gain valuable work experience, learn about services at Humber and earn extra money. Most positions offer flexibility to accommodate your study schedule.

WORKING OFF CAMPUS

Working off campus is a great opportunity to gain first-hand experience within a Canadian company and work environment. You must have a valid study permit that states you are eligible to work off campus.

ADVANCED DIPLOMA, GAME PROGRAMMING

Video games have always been a part of my life, but I never thought of making a career out of it. Until one day I was playing a Ubisoft game and it inspired me to follow a path in the video game industry.

Game Programming is a video game-focused program, but the skills you learn are transferable to other industries. Depending on your career goals, you can either choose to work for a video game studio or a software developer.

Thanks to Humber's networking opportunities, I landed my first job while I was still in my first semester. For the past three years, I have worked with two different companies as a game developer and a junior developer. Since 2019, I have been working part-time as a programmer for UP360, a start-up based in Toronto.

During the same time, I also worked as a Peer Tutor at Humber College and initiated an ongoing project that involved the Faculty of Media & Creative Arts and the Barrett Centre for Technology Innovation. The goal was to build a financially affordable breath controller that would help people who have motor neuron disease so they can interact more easily with video games.

I also represented Humber College at hackathons across North America, such as Hack the North, BostonHacks and MHacks. These hackathons helped me gain new skills and also provided me with the opportunity to work with real-world issues.

RECOMMENDED APPLICATION DATES

Admission to Humber is a competitive process. Some programs have limited seats for international students and, therefore, we recommend applying early for your best chances for consideration into your first choice program. Please note that we will not be processing applications until eight to ten months prior to the start of the selected term. We prioritize applications that include all documents required to make an admission decision. Please review the admission requirements by country to ensure all documents are submitted.

ACADEMIC YEAR INTAKE DATES

At Humber, the academic year is divided into three semesters: fall, winter and summer. The fall semester begins in September and finishes in December. The winter semester starts in January and runs till the end of April. Also, many programs are offered during the summer semester, which begins in May and ends in August.

- Best time to apply for January 2024 is May 2023
- Best time to apply for May 2024 is September 2023
- Best time to apply for September 2024 is November 2023

Housing Options

ON-CAMPUS RESIDENCE

Humber provides residence for up to 1,450 students at our two campuses. Due to the limited availability of rooms and the highly competitive nature of the application process, we strongly encourage prospective students to apply early to be considered.

NOTE: On-campus housing is limited and is offered on a first-come, first-served basis. Once you receive a room in residence, you will be required to provide a \$500 CAD deposit to the Humber Residence Department. The \$500 CAD is non-refundable; please do not pay until you have been assigned a residence room.

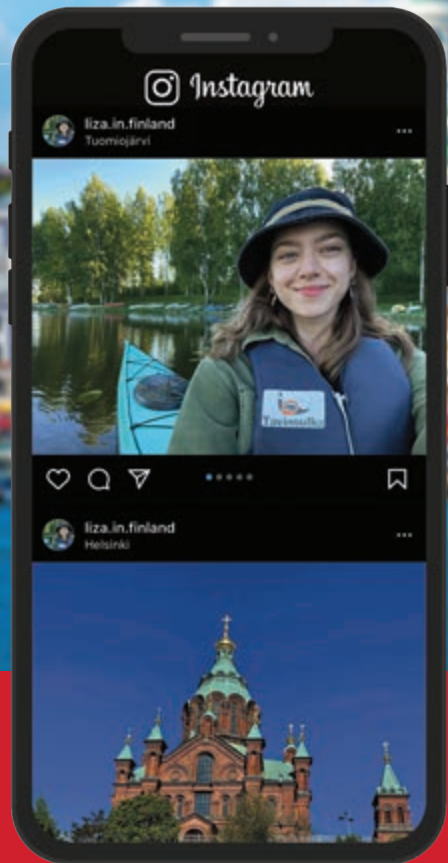

Scholarships

INTERNATIONAL ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

This entrance scholarship is available to Ontario Graduate Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma students joining Humber every term. It is limited to the top 20 applicants each term with the highest academic achievements in their previous studies; these students receive \$2,000 CAD off their tuition fees over the course of their first year of studies.

All students applying to a bachelor's degree program at Humber will be automatically considered for these scholarships. Bachelor's degree scholarships are available to non-transfer students only, coming directly from high school/secondary school. No scholarship application is required.

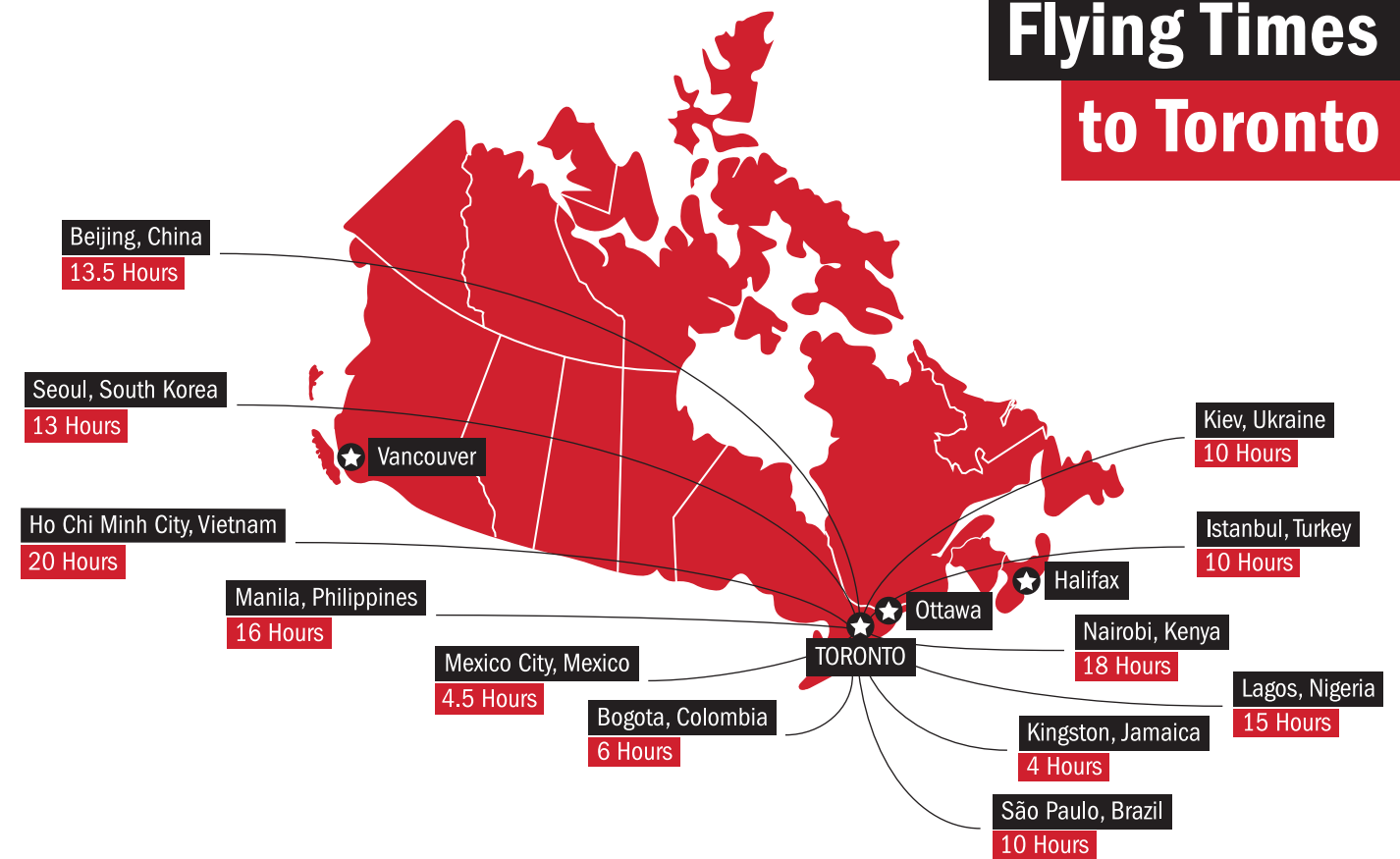
